

Year 4 iPad Programme Managing Storage Space

Introduction

This document contains instructions for managing storage space on your iPad Air. Your iPad's total capacity will be 16GB, 32GB, 64GB or 128GB. However, some space is used for the operating system, built-in apps and system memory, leaving approximately the following amount available.

Model	Total Capacity (approx.)
iPad Air 16 GB	12.8 GB
iPad Air 32 GB	28 GB
iPad Air 64 GB	57 GB
iPad Air 128 GB	114 GB

The available storage space on your iPad will be used up by the following:

- Apps
- Documents and data created within apps.



About your iPad

To display information about your iPad, including its capacity in gigabytes (GB) and the number of apps, photos, videos and songs loaded, open 'Settings' and select 'General' and then 'About'.




<u>Usage</u>

To display the amount of storage space currently used by each app, open 'Settings' and select 'General' and then 'Usage'. The amount of storage space used by each app is listed here, with those using the most space listed first.

Freeing up Storage Space

The following actions can be carried out to free up storage space on your iPad.

1. Deleting Apps

You may decide to delete entire apps, along with all its data and documents, from your iPad. Reasons for doing this include:

- The app was only required short term for school use.
 (A list of school apps that can now be deleted is included at the end of this document.)
- The app was downloaded for home use and is no longer required
- The app was automatically downloaded for home use because you share an Apple ID with other members of your family, and you do not require the app.

If you delete an app, all of the data and documents within the app will also be deleted and cannot be subsequently recovered. However, you can re-download the app at any time without having to repurchase it, because it is already recorded as a purchase on your Apple Account. Hence, this is a good way of freeing up space until you need the app again.

To delete an app, along with all the documents and data created within the app.

- a. If you have 'Restrictions' enabled, ensure that 'Deleting Apps' is allowed.
 - Go to 'Settings > General > Restrictions'
 - Enter your Restrictions Passcode
 - Turn 'Deleting Apps' on
- b. Go to 'Settings > General > Usage' and click on the app you wish to delete.

c. Double-check that you want to delete the app, and then press the 'Delete App' button.



Alternative Method:



You can also delete apps by pressing down on the app icon until it starts to wiggle. An 'x' will appear in the top left hand corner, which you can click on to delete the app.


2. Deleting Documents and Data within an App

Often, you will not want to delete an entire app, but you can delete documents or projects within the app. Reasons for doing this include:


- The document or project has been completed and printed or copied to the school server.
- Several backup copies of a document or project exist that are not required.
- The document or project was for home use or to learn how to use the app and is no longer required.

To delete documents, projects and data within an app you will need to open the app and go to the screen that lists all of the content that you have created. From there, you should be able to find a delete button for any content you wish to delete. Each app does it slightly differently, but here are a couple of examples.




3. Delete photos and videos

A common cause of storage space being filled up quickly is by accumulating photos and videos on the camera roll.

Just like with a digital camera or video camera, photos and videos can be copied from your iPad to a PC or Mac by plugging it in using the iPad to USB cable that comes with the iPad. Your photos and videos then appear in Windows Explorer or iPhoto and you can make copies or delete them from there.

Alternatively, if you want to delete photos and videos directly from your iPad, open the 'Photos' app and select the photos and videos that can be deleted.



4. Deleting other media

Other media such as music, movies, iBooks, audio books and podcasts can be downloaded from the iTunes and iBooks stores. Depending on the type of media, they are then loaded and stored in the 'Music', 'Videos', 'iBooks' and 'Podcasts' apps. Media can also be downloaded into these apps if you share an Apple ID with other members of your family and automatic downloads are turned on or iTunes synchronization has taken place.

These apps can be reviewed periodically and unrequired media can be deleted. To delete media in the different apps:

- Music Swipe from right to left over a song and press 'Delete'
- Videos Press 'Edit', press the 'x' in the top left corner of the video and then select 'Delete'
- iBooks Press 'Edit', select the iBooks(s) to delete and then press 'Delete'
- Podcasts Swipe from right to left over a podcast and press 'Delete'
