

Schools around Australia are giving girls the option to wear pants which reminds me of our school is allowed to wear pants


The African story reminded me of our inquiry about migrated.

Note to teacher: this reflection works best following a specific experience or text: eg – a video, a guest speaker or a book.










Mining was very challenging. We had a number of rules we had to follow. Here are the rules: . Keep dust of others land






Benefits of iPads





Process for loading apps

- An Apple ID needs to be created before apps can be downloaded.
- Free apps can be loaded as soon as is practical.
- A list of app redemption codes will be supplied to each student on the first day of school next year, from which they can download the rest of the apps.
- More apps may be selected during year 4, 5, 6 & 7 school years as necessary.
